Graduate Assistant: Extension, Teaching, and Research

We seek a graduate assistant to support teaching, research, and extension efforts in our Extension Education program. This assistantship is 20 hours per week and will include teaching undergraduate Extension Education courses and conducting research that explores career pathways, including Extension Education, in the food, agricultural, natural resources, and human sciences.

This 3-year assistantship begins in the fall of 2026.

Strong oral and written communication skills, a desire to extend skills in research and program evaluation, and knowledge of Extension work are essential.

The applicant must pursue a full-time, on-campus doctoral-level graduate degree in the Department of Agricultural and Human Sciences and complete a dissertation.
